**TWO NATIONAL EPA AWARDS FOR ENERGYLOGIC**

*Berthoud-based firm verified 20 percent of all new homes built in Colorado in 2009; saved consumers \$1.3 million in utility bills.*

Denver, CO – The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has awarded EnergyLogic, Inc. a 2010 ENERGY STAR Partner of the Year and a 2010 ENERGY STAR for Homes Leadership in Housing Award. Both awards recognize Energy Logic’s outstanding contribution to reducing greenhouse gas emissions through its work as a home energy rater.

EnergyLogic qualified 3,008 new homes in 2009 to earn the ENERGY STAR rating. This is equivalent to:

- More than **20 percent** of all new homes built in Colorado in 2010
- Saving homeowners **\$1,344,576** on their utility bills
- Eliminating the emissions from **1,473.92** vehicles
- Saving **8,915,712** lbs of coal
- Planting **2,436.48** acres of trees

EnergyLogic is a home energy rating, training and software development firm based in Berthoud, Colorado. It provides services to over 100 homebuilders and has trained over 400 energy raters and auditors and oversees 100 ENERGY STAR Rater Partners.

“In today’s economy, home buyers are looking for value, and the energy-efficient homes that earn the ENERGY STAR provide that extra value,” said Steve Byers, Principal, EnergyLogic. “Homes built to ENERGY STAR standards are more comfortable and provide a healthier indoor environment, plus they ensure long-term savings on energy bills while protecting the environment.”

The 2010 Partner of the Year Awards are given to a variety of organizations to recognize their contribution to reducing greenhouse gas emissions by promoting energy-efficient homes in their community. Award winners are selected from more than 17,000 organizations that participate in the ENERGY STAR program. ENERGY STAR qualified new homes use substantially less energy for heating, cooling, and water heating – homeowners can expect to save about \$200-\$400 annually on their utility bills. Currently more than 8,500 builders across the nation are constructing homes that meet EPA’s strict guidelines for energy efficiency. More than one million American families now live in ENERGY STAR qualified homes.

Last year alone Americans with the help of ENERGY STAR saved \$17 billion on their energy bills and reduced greenhouse gas emissions equivalent to those of 30 million vehicles.
